Our Uniform

Our uniform was agreed following consultation with pupils, parents/carers and staff. We understand tensions can arise in homes when young people challenge the wearing of school uniform. We also understand the pressure placed on parents/carers to buy their children expensive items of clothing to wear to school in order for the child to feel that they fit in with their peers.

Working in partnership between home and school can help young people resist such pressures and develop their understanding of school as a place of learning and work. School uniforms are an economical and practical solution that take away the debate about what to wear to school.

Returning S6 pupils are expected to wear full school uniform including the S6 tie and prefect blazer, this is part of our leadership expectations for all pupils *choosing* to return for a final year.
